Provide physicians, nurses and other health care providers with up-to-date information on new trends and developments in the prevention and treatment of childhood and adolescent diseases.

ELEMENTS OF COMPETENCE

Furthermore, the members of the conference planning committee, considered experts in this field, identified issues that have seen significant advances in recent years and that will be most applicable to attendees' clinical work.
