Helping Hands™

Helping Hands™ has supported families for over 30 years. All families are eligible to receive a one-time shipment of Enfamil® product, per child, per household. Additional support may be available for parents of multiples and those qualifying for long-term assistance. [Contact your Mead Johnson Nutrition representative for details.](#)

Once enrolled in Helping Hands, eligible families will automatically* be enrolled in **Enfamil Family Beginnings®** in which families can receive up to \$400 in free gifts, baby formula coupons, baby formula samples, special offers, and other savings.

Families who qualify will also be enrolled in applicable savings programs including **Nutramigen® Savings and Support** or **EnfaCare® Drive to Thrive**.

Nationwide Assistance Programs

Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC†)

In addition to the programs offered by Mead Johnson Nutrition, families who require financial support may qualify for the USDA WIC Program. WIC provides infant formula vouchers and food vouchers on a WIC Card, and nutrition education to low-income pregnant and postpartum women, plus infants and children up to age 5 who are found to be at nutritional risk.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP‡)

Formerly known as the “food stamp” program, SNAP provides a monthly dollar amount on a preloaded card to families who qualify. Participants have the added flexibility to use their SNAP benefits to purchase food and any baby formula, including Enfamil® products, online and in-store.

Households eligible for both WIC and SNAP should be able to receive benefits from both programs at the same time.
